# From black & white to streaming bright!

Did you know that TVs now are very different from the ones people had in the past?

#### **Televisions**

THEN: The first television set was sold in 1929. It could only show programmes in black and white. There was no remote control. To change channels, you had to get up and press the buttons on the TV.

**NOW:** We have smart TVs. We can control the TV with a remote control or our smartphone. We can also download and install apps on

these smart TVs.

#### TV shows

THEN: The backgrounds, costumes and



watch them later.

special effects were simple. The themes of the shows were usually family friendly.

**NOW:** There are a lot more TV shows, and they have a much wider range of themes. The visual effects are so good, we can imagine we are actually IN the show!

#### The way we watch TV

**THEN:** Many TV shows were live and there were usually no reruns. You usually had to wait a whole week for the next episode! Video recorders became popular in the 1980s. People could record programmes and

NOW: With the rise of streaming platforms, we can watch more than one episode of a show at a time! We can watch different



programmes whenever we like, even on a smartphone or computer.


