Green getaways

Many people enjoy exploring nature, but sometimes this causes pollution and harms wildlife. Ecotourism is the answer!

What is ecotourism?



Protecting nature

When you go on an ecotour, you stay on marked trails and try not to disturb the wildlife. Also, part of the money you pay helps protect the area you are visiting.



👺 Supporting the local people

You can do this by staying in an eco-friendly hotel or guesthouse, buying local crafts and eating at local restaurants. This helps the local people earn a living and care for their environment too.





🔏 Knowledge and respect

On an ecotour, you might visit a rainforest, learn about its plants and animals, and talk with local people. Ecotourism is about understanding and respecting the world around us.



Elephant Nature Park, Thailand

This park is in Chiang Mai province. It is a rescue centre for mistreated and injured elephants. The park shows visitors how to care for elephants and has strict rules to make sure visitors don't harm the elephants or the environment.
