The world's youngest video game developer

Most children enjoy playing video games. One young girl doesn't just enjoy playing them. She created one! At just six years old, Simar Khurana became the world's youngest video game developer.



Simar's father knew that his daughter was clever. She taught herself Maths by watching videos online. When she was in kindergarten, she could already do Primary 3 Maths. Simar is a curious student so she learns quickly. She is also very creative. Her father says, 'She is always doing crafts and making games out of waste paper and all kinds of other things.' He

thought coding might be the perfect fit for Simar. Coders write instructions for computers so they need to be creative and good at Maths. Simar took a taster class in coding and loved it.

However, when Simar's parents tried to find a regular coding class for her, most teachers said she was too young. They argued that coders also need to be good at reading and writing 20 at a high level. Simar's parents didn't give up. Finally, they found her a teacher. She started going to coding

classes three times a week.







- Simar's video game idea came from a visit to her doctor. He told Simar that she needed to eat more healthily and avoid junk food. This gave her an idea to create a video game called 'Healthy Food Challenge'. In the game, players choose a character to take part in a race.
- Players decide what food their character eats before the race. They watch the race so that they can see how a healthy diet improves their character's performance.

'harder than you expect'. She started taking
an extra coding class every week. She
continued with her dance, gymnastics and
karate classes so that she had some time
away from her computer. On top of all this,
she also needed to go to school! Fortunately,

as her workload increased.



I asked Simar, 'What do you want to be when you grow up?' She replied, perhaps unsurprisingly, 'I want to be a video game developer.' According to the Guinness World Records, she already is!



Robots in action

These days, we see robots everywhere in everyday life. They are not just toys. They are super helpers too!

Read on to find out how robots work with humans.

Robo-waiters

Some restaurants have robo-waiters. They take orders, serve food and bring the bill to customers. Some restaurants even have robots in the kitchen to help their chefs.



For example, they can collect ingredients to make simple dishes or mix drinks.
